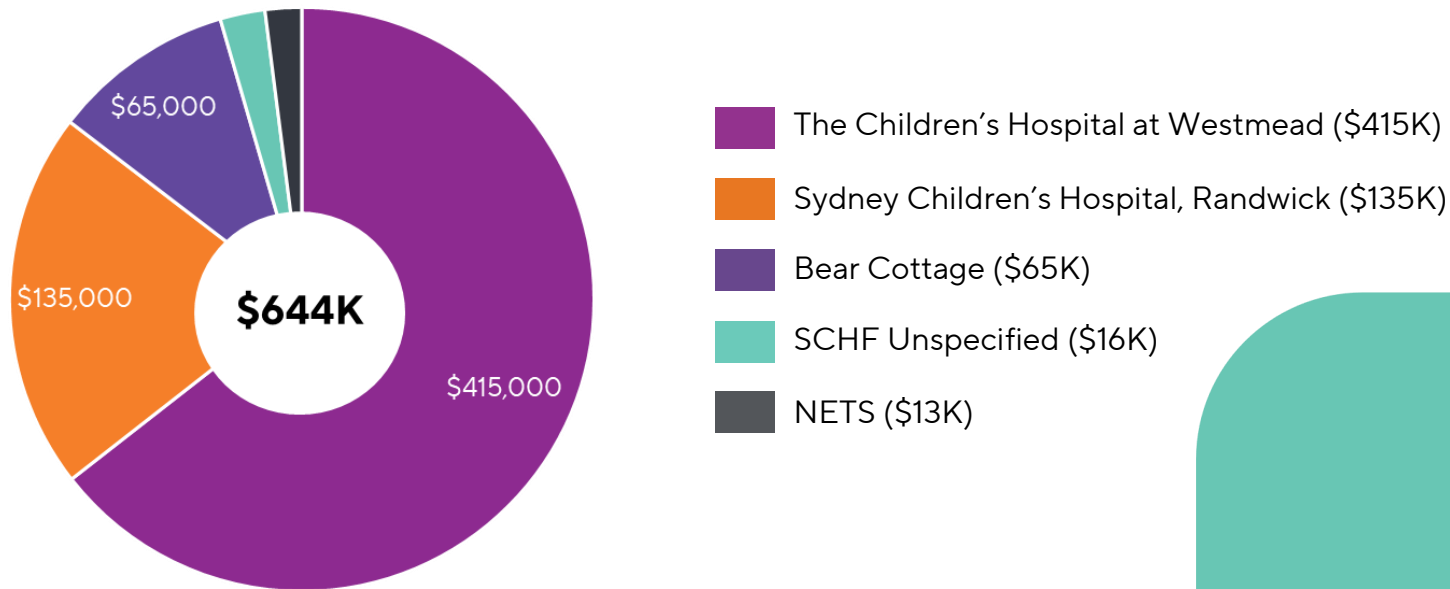


Workplace Giving – Your support in action

Workplace Giving donations contributed to the record-breaking \$76 million raised by Sydney Children's Hospitals Foundation in FY22, to go directly to the front line of children's healthcare.

Your workplace giving donations and company matching raised \$644K for all sick kids, no matter where, no matter what.



Following are examples of how your workplace giving donations have helped SCHF fund critical positions, projects or equipment over the past year* to have an impact on children's health, now and into the future.



Research

7 positions in the Kids Research Clinical Trials Centre to safely test promising new treatments that offer families hope, with early access to advanced therapies that can improve or save a child's life.

4 major research projects including a program to identify and support disadvantaged children with cerebral palsy; identifying key issues for children living with a chronic illness, an integrated care model where paediatricians work directly with GPs to improve paediatric care for children closer to home, and a big data project using new technologies and AI to analyse critical information to improve treatment decisions with a Phase I pilot study on children with congenital heart disease in the newborn ICU.

2 positions in the Gene Therapy Research Unit to accelerate gene and gene-modified cell therapies to help children with rare diseases.

24 key positions in Kids Research to provide vital support to all the committed research teams and innovative research projects running across the hospitals.

1 PhD Scholarship studying whether powered wheelchairs can improve the lives of children and young people with neuromuscular conditions.



Patient Experience

Bedside patient and information system to give the 56,000 children admitted to hospital each year access to movies, games and entertainment channels as well as patient information including daily goals for the child to achieve.

8 Child Life and Music Therapists across Sydney Children's Hospital, Randwick and The Children's Hospital at Westmead who use play, music, education and self-expression activities to help children and young people cope with their illness and hospitalisation.

Grocery and other vouchers for essential items to help sick children and families experiencing financial distress.

Clinical Care

9 positions in the Centre for Childhood Cancer at The Children's Hospital at Westmead across nursing, medical, music and play therapy and social work.

13 positions in the Emergency Department at Sydney Children's Hospital, Randwick including nursing and medical staff working on key projects to improve the critical care of more than 36,000 children each year.

13 positions for Bear Cottage to support 168 families each year with dedicated paediatric palliative care for children with a life-limiting condition.

New equipment at The Children's Hospital at Westmead including ultrasound and diathermy machines.

10 Fellowships for paediatric trainees to undertake essential training to become a specialist paediatrician in a selected field. In the past year, you helped us fund Fellowships in cardiology, Aboriginal health, community child health, emergency, general surgery, renal, sleep, dermatology and pain medicine.

2 Aboriginal Public Health Trainees undertaking a three-year training program to deliver healthcare programs for Aboriginal children and young people. Co-funded with NSW Health, this program also creates future Aboriginal health leaders.
